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14.2 Human Genetic Disorders Changes in a gene's DNA sequence can change proteins by altering their amino acid sequences, which may directly affect one's phenotype. If nondisjunction occurs during meiosis, gametes with an abnormal number of chromosomes may result, leading to a disorder of chromosome numbers.
