Within this text, speech sound disorder and phonological disorder are separated. Articulation disorder, as a subcategory of a speech sound disorder, is the atypical production of speech sounds characterized by substitutions, omissions, additions, or deletions that may interfere with intelligibility (p. 7- 8).

Historically, these disorders are referred to as articulation disorders and phonological disorders, respectively. Articulation disorders focus on errors (e.g., distortions and substitutions) in production of individual speech sounds. Phonological disorders focus on predictable, rule-based errors (e.g., fronting, stopping,

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and final consonant deletion) that affect more than one sound. It is often difficult to cleanly differentiate between articulation and phonological disorders; therefore ...

Speech Sound Disorders: Articulation and Phonology: Overview

This is not a speech sound disorder, but rather one of the phonological features of AAVE.” Phonological Processing Disorder: If a child’s speech sound substitutions involve a pattern of sound errors (i.e. substituting the “t” sound for the “k” sound consistently in all contexts), the child may have a Phonological Processing Disorder.

Articulation Disorders vs. Phonological Processing ...

Articulation disorders manifest when a child has difficulty producing a specific sound (or sounds) and are remediated by addressing the sound (s) in error. Phonological disorders are more complex, as they are patterns in a child’s speech used to simplify speech sound production.

Articulation Disorder or Phonological Disorder? What is ...

The difference between an Articulation and a Phonological disorder; An articulation disorder is the child’s difficulty at a phonetic/motoric level. They have trouble making the individual speech sounds. A phonological disorder is a child’s difficulty at their phonemic level (in their brain).

Introduction. Developmental speech sound disorder (SSD) encompasses a wide range of difficulties with the production of speech in children, and is defined in DSM-5 (American Psychiatric Association, 2013) as a ‘persistent difficulty with speech sound production that interferes with speech intelligibility or prevents verbal communication’ that cannot be explained in terms of sensory ...

Speech problems – articulation and phonological disorders
Articulation and phonology (fon-ol-oji) refer to the way sound is

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produced. A child with an articulation disorder has problems forming speech sounds properly. A child with a phonological disorder can produce the sounds correctly, but may use them in the wrong place.

Phonological Disorder Prognosis. All situations are different, so we cannot provide a specific prognosis for improvement. In general, like articulation disorders, the prognosis of phonological disorders depends on the cause and severity of the disorder. In many cases, phonological errors can be eliminated completely with treatment and practice.

Speech disorders can be categorized into two primary types: articulation disorders and phonological disorders. A child with an articulation disorder will have difficulty producing a particular sound (e.g., difficulty saying "r" in words or lisping). Phonological disorders refer to the use of a pattern of errors.

Articulation disorders Articulation disorders (also called phonetic

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disorders, or simply "artic disorders" for short) are based on difficulty learning to physically produce the intended phonemes. Articulation disorders have to do with the main articulators which are the lips, teeth, alveolar ridge, hard palate, velum, glottis, and the tongue.
