ForcEject is a tiny little tool of about 100KB that simply does what is intended and tries to force your Superdrive to eject its stuck optical disc. To use the ForcEject Tool, download and run it and an icon will appear on your menu bar. Click on the icon to popup a menu and either select to eject an internal or external SuperDrive.

Your first stop will be Disk Utility, located at /Applications/Utilites/Disk Utility.app. Find your disc in the left sidebar and click the eject button up top, or right-click on the disc and select the eject command. You can also eject using OS X's Disk Utility.

Quick Tip: How to Force Eject a Stuck Disc

In order to eject you can Control-click or right-click the disc icon and choose Eject from the menu that appears. You can also drag the disc icon to the trash. For computers that did not ship with an optical drive and do not have the Apple USB SuperDrive, you can use CD or DVD sharing to access a CD or DVD in another computer's optical drive.

Eject from iTunes and Disk Utility A few applications, for example, iTunes and Disk Utility, have an option in their menus or toolbar. You can fire up the app and click on the Eject option there to pop out your CD or DVD. Eject in Disk Utility
