The Elements of Style by William Strunk and E. B. White - The Classic Writing Style Guide - This book aims to give in brief space the principal requirements of plain English style. It aims to lighten the task of instructor and student by concentrating attention (in Chapters II and III) on a few essentials, the rules of usage and principles of composition most commonly violated.

## The Elements of Style: The Classic Writing Style Guide ...

White's expansion and modernization of Strunk and Tenney's 1935 revised edition yielded the writing style manual informally known as "Strunk & White", the first edition of which sold about two million copies in 1959. More than ten million copies of three editions were later sold.

The Diversity Style Guide adds that “other [style guides], like ‘The Chicago Manual of Style,’ allow capitalization if an author or publication prefers. *Essence* and *Ebony* magazines, *The Chicago Defender*, and many other publications serving African-American communities capitalize Black; some, but not all, capitalize White.

## **The Elements of Style**

To refer to non-White racial and ethnic groups collectively, use terms such as “people of color” or “underrepresented groups” rather than “minorities.” The use of “minority” may be viewed pejoratively because it is usually equated with being less than, oppressed, or deficient in comparison with the majority (i.e., White people).

## **Racial and Ethnic Identity - APA Style**

First, Strunk and White weren't people who devoted their lives to studying grammar, and they didn't work together to create *The Elements of Style*. William Strunk taught English at Cornell and wrote the first version of the book—which was only 43 pages—for his English students at Cornell. In a sense, the book was his own personal style guide.

known on the campus in those days as "the little book," with the stress on the word "little." It had been privately printed by the author. (\* E. B. White wrote this introduction for the 1979 edition.)

The first is broad adherence to a general rule—like, say, the Chicago Manual of Style's (§8.38) edict that "Names of ethnic and national groups are capitalized." (Though Chicago still generally mandates lowercasing both black and white, it does include the proviso that the rule can be suspended if "a particular author or publisher prefers otherwise.")

### **AP tackles language about race in this year's style guide**

William Strunk, Jr. first used his own book, *The Elements of Style*,

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in 1919 for his English 8 course at Cornell University. The book was published in 1935 by Oliver Strunk. E. B. White was a student in Professor Strunk's class at Cornell, and used "the little book" for himself. Commissioned by Macmillan to revise Strunk's book, White edited the 1959 and 1972 editions of *The Elements of Style*.

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
